Impressions and Memories Dear friends,

## The strengths

- There is depth and solidity in members and a deep rootedness in the Ignatian charism
- A sense of unity, despite the vast geographic distances
- An openness to take stock and review. This was seen in the thorough evaluation undertaken regarding the living out of your Life and Mission.
- Much care is taken to help new members integrate well into the national community
- Ongoing efforts to attract and retain new members, especially young people.
- Good relations with the Society of Jesus
- An attentiveness to the needs and call of the Church (although more can be done here)
- The meticulous preparation for the new Statutes reveals a praiseworthy sense of dedication
- There are a number of 'wisdom figures' in the community and this is a great resource
- Generosity to explore and take on a Mission (eg. Haiti)
- a Passion to fight for Justice and help build the Kingdom.

## Some Challenges

- The distances (well, not much can be done about this)
- Difficulties in getting youth to hear our testimonies and share our life
- The imbalance in payment of the 'donation' is a major concern. The community is at risk if 43 % of the members do not contribute.
- It would be good if there is more availability to take on leadership roles within the community. We cannot expect just a few persons to shoulder this load all the time.
- Explore the possibility of more links with French-Canada and the USA (also, keep in mind my suggestion about the next World Assembly).
- Find ways to be more visible. Do not hide your lamp under a bushel.
