

## Tell Us About your Apostolic Work in the Four “Frontiers”

Dear CLC’ers:

As you know, the 2013 CLC World Assembly in Lebanon confirmed four “frontiers” to prioritize for apostolic action, as a result of its consultations with the world communities. These frontiers were recently summarized in our CLC World President’s letter as follows:

**A. Globalization and Poverty**, undeniable signs of the ‘culture of waste’ which Pope Francis has strongly condemned, and which we wish to turn into a globalization of hope;

**B. Family**, strengthening this central core of society while developing an attitude of openness, compassion, respect and sensitivity towards those belonging to diverse realities;

**C. Ecology**, as a call to re-visit our ‘simple lifestyle’ (GP 4) and think of future generations and care for the most vulnerable;

**D. Youth**, not only to engage with and attract youth to CLC but particularly to offer apostolic service to this group which signifies the future of our societies.

Following our CLC Canada National Assembly in June of 2014, it was decided that working groups would be struck for each of these frontiers. The purpose of these working groups would be first, to gather information about the needs in each frontier, to understand what work has been undertaken in these areas to date, to network with other communities (nationally and internationally) and Ignatian partners who have worked in these areas, to identify best practices and to discern how our Ignatian charism can help us to contribute meaningfully to these frontiers.

Once this gathering/networking phase is complete, the working groups will then move to preparing materials to educate our communities on issues relating to these frontiers and propose reflection materials and apostolic initiatives.
